Costs are to be paid by the client. Payment forms accepted are Cash, Check, Money Orders and Credit Cards.

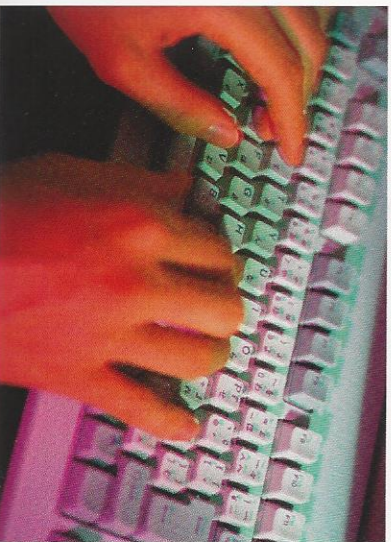
Initial Setup Fee: \$100.00

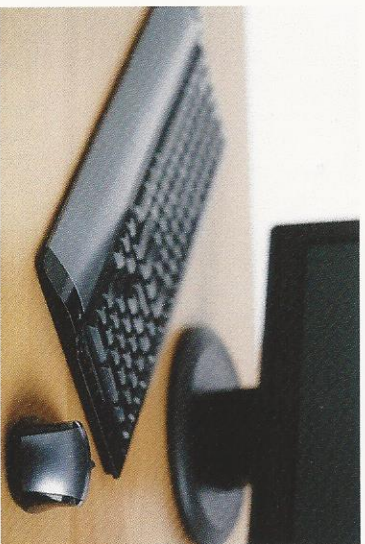

Project Point of Light

Remote Access Computer Monitoring

Project Point of Light is now able to monitor and manage computers and smartphones through Internet Probation and Parole Control, Inc. (IPPC).

This service is designed to manage high-risk computer users in order to prevent any inappropriate computer access.



Referrals

Referrals to the program can be made by various social service agencies such as probation/parole, juvenile probation, children & youth services, or any agency dealing with sexual abuse. Self-referrals can also be made.

Non-Confidentiality

Adult and adolescent offenders will be required to sign an acknowledgement of non-confidentiality. The waiver insures that information is shared and services are coordinated to reduce the risk of re-offending.

Description of Services

The Internet creates numerous temptations to view sexually deviant materials. IPPC is designed to monitor high-risk computer users by remote access. The content that is monitored includes websites, chats, files transferred, videos viewed online, and more. This content is then filtered by targeting and scanning specific keywords. Any inappropriate content that is detected is immediately reported to PPOL and the referral source is then notified.

Block Internet Access

Internet blockage is another option in addition to monitoring. This feature is available to block all internet communications regardless of how the offender attempts to connect to the internet.

Polygraph and Computer

Monitoring

Polygraphs play an important role with computer monitoring by creating an adjunct to treatment. Pornography can negate treatment gains. Polygraph questions can be based around the use of the internet on other non-monitored devices. It can also be used to explore whether or not the client has access to the internet through non-approved internet tools, such as cell phones, public libraries, etc.
